### THE PROGRAM

Capitol Hill Arts Workshop Youth Arts Program (YAP) is a multidisciplinary curriculum of classes, performance, and exhibition opportunities offered after-school for students in grades K - 6. The Youth Arts Program exposes students to a variety of artistic disciplines while encouraging them to work in the community with their peers as they explore various cultures and build on their experience and knowledge of the arts. Drawing from local schools, the Youth Arts Program provides students a safe place to learn and create while receiving an outstanding education outside of the regular school day.

### GOALS:

1. To encourage students to learn commitment and discipline while studying the arts
2. To provide a place where students from various racial, socio-economic, and geographic backgrounds learn to work together
3. To foster self-esteem and a sense of accomplishment in young people as they achieve self-awareness and learn about their peers
4. To develop a lifelong appreciation for the arts and arts education
5. To pursue artistic excellence and high quality instruction, assisted by qualified, experienced teaching artists, and staff
